Interprofessional collaboration has been defined as “an umbrella term referring to all models of collaboration whereby two or more professionals representing different disciplines work together in treatment or assessment of a shared client.”

It is the duty of BCBAs to model collaborative practices that uphold the BACB Code, promote client wellbeing, and reduce barriers that undermine coordinated care. These data are slightly sobering in two ways. First, they suggest a discrepancy in the mutual perceptions between these disciplines.
